California Probation officers undergo extensive and ongoing training, including trauma-informed care, cognitive behavioral therapy and therapeutic and strength-based care. This training ensures probation professionals are prepared to manage trauma and other needs of system-involved individuals.

Probation Departments have a profound impact on the safety and health of our communities. Their work to address the underlying causes of crime through evidence-based supervision and individualized rehabilitative supports and services reduces recidivism.
